The National Election Commission announced that nominations for the Local Government Election will be called from 18- 21 January 2023.


Days after the calling of nominations, Opposition Leader Sajith Premadasa questioned a directive given by the Cabinet of Ministers to stop accepting

H5 Government issues new regulations for PAYE Tax

The government decided to prohibit state and semigovernment institutions from paying the Pay As You Earn Tax of employees through the respective institutions' funds.

The Finance Ministry said the PAYE Tax was

introduced for employees of state and semigovernment institutions earning an income surpassing a specified level.

However, it was found that the funds had been utilized to settle the tax payments of employees.







#44 Canada imposes targeted sanctions against Rajapaksa brothers

Canada imposed targeted sanctions under regulations according to the Special Economic Measures Act against four Sri Lankan state officials responsible for gross and systematic violations of human rights during the armed conflict in Sri Lanka, which occurred from 1983 to 2009.

Accordingly, Canada imposed targeted sanctions against former Presidents Gotabaya Rajapaksa and Mahinda Rajapaksa, Staff Sergeant Sunil Ratnayake, and Lieutenant Commander Chandana Hettiarachchi.

#5 Easter Attacks : Maithripala Sirisena ordered to pay Rs 100 MN compensation

The Supreme Court of Sri Lanka ordered a group of former government officials, including former President Maithripala Sirisena to pay compensation for the victims of the 2019 Easter Sunday attacks.

Issuing the verdict, the Supreme Court ordered former President Maithripala Sirisena to pay Rs. 100 million, and former Secretary of Defence Hemasiri Fernando to pay Rs. 50 million in compensation.

FIFA suspends Sri Lanka Football




Football Federation of Sri Lanka (FFSL) was suspended by FIFA from January 21, 2023, until further notice

#12 New Tax including PAYE : Three key points from President's speech in Parliament

Delivering the Government's Policy Statement in Parliament, the President said compared to other countries, Sri Lanka's direct tax is low and called for the correction of this tax divergence.

If PAYE tax is abolished, the country will lose Rs. 100 billion. If the tax limit is raised to Rs. 200,000, the economy will lose Rs. 63 billion. The total amount that will be lost is Rs. 163 billion.

It is required to ensure proper collection of taxes from those directly liable to pay, to reduce the burden on the general public.

H Cabinet approval to ban several items of plastic

The Cabinet of Ministers approved the proposal presented by the Minister of Environment to ban several plastic products in Sri Lanka.

Accordingly, the ban on the production, importation, selling and use of the following items

is effective from June 01, 2023.

- Single-use plastic straws and stirrers
- Plastic yoghurt spoons, plates, cups, knives etc.
- Plastic flower garlands
- Plastic string hopper trays

H Permission given to kill six animals damaging crops

Minister of Agriculture Mahinda Amaraweera announced that farmers are permitted to kill peacocks, monkeys, toque macaques, grizzled giant squirrels, porcupines, and wild boars that are found to be destroying crops.

During a meeting with potato farmers, the minister revealed that the six crop-ravaging animals have been removed from the list of protected animals in Sri Lanka and that farmers were at liberty to use any measures to tackle the menace.



#15 Inquiry finds fault with General Shavendra on May 9th violence

A 3-member Presidential Committee determined that former Army Commander Shavendra Silva neglected his duties in not taking necessary action to prevent violence that took place in the country on the 9th and 10th of May 2022.

The committee appointed by former President Gotabaya Rajapaksa to inquire into the May 9th incidents recommended that the Criminal Investigations Department should launch a probe against Shavendra Silva.

H16 President released from 108 lawsuits

The Colombo District Court ordered the release of President Ranil Wickremesinghe from 108 lawsuits pertaining to the 2019 Easter Sunday attacks.

Announcing the decision, the judge observed that the second defendant, Ranil Wickremesinghe, is entitled to immunity in terms of Article 35(1) of the Constitution as the President of Sri Lanka.

#17 Sri Lanka thanks countries for supporting its debt restructuring process

The Sri Lankan Government extended its gratitude to India, China, the Paris Club, Saudi Arabia, Pakistan, Hungary and Kuwait for providing debt restructuring assurances to the International Monetary Fund (IMF).

Chinese Premier Li Keqiang also informed the IMF that China is willing to play a constructive part in debt talks involving heavily indebted nations, such as Sri Lanka.

#18 Islandwide strike by several state sector trade unions



An islandwide strike action was held by trade unions of the health, ports, power, water, railways, postal, and banking sectors.

The strike action was staged over several demands, including the government's new tax policy and the recent hike in electricity tariffs.

HI9 Law exam English-only proposal defeated in Parliament



The proposal to Parliament that all courses and exams conducted at the Sri Lanka Law College should be conducted in the English Medium was defeated during a vote in Parliament.


The Parliament announced that the Rules under the Council of Legal Education Ordinance (Chapter 276) presented in Parliament received 1 vote for and 113 against.



#20 IMF approves US\$3 Billion for Sri Lanka

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) Board approved a 48-month extended arrangement under the Extended Fund Facility of SDR 2.286 billion (about US\$3 billion) to support Sri Lanka's economic policies and reforms.

The government of Sri Lanka used a portion of the first disbursement from the IMF, around USD 121 million from the USD 333 million received, to settle a loan instalment of the Indian Credit Line.



#22 Sri Lanka Catholic Church seeks UN-led probe on Easter attacks

On the fourth anniversary of the Easter Sunday bombings, the Archdiocese of Colombo, in an interview with Vatican News, sought justice by calling for a UN-led international investigation.

Lamenting the lack of justice for the bombings, Fr. Julian Patrick Perera of Sri Lanka's Catholic Church alleged there appears to be evidence of a cover-up, pointing to the removal of several key investigators from the case.

#23 Bangladesh gives more time for SL to repay loan

Bangladesh extended the repayment period of Sri Lanka's \$200 million loan it had given, by six more months.

Bangladesh Bank Governor Abdur Rouf Talukder revealed Sri Lanka sought six more months,

assuring it would make its first instalment by August this year and another instalment by September.










#24 Govt prohibits political meetings at Galle Face Green



The Cabinet of Ministers decided to prohibit musical shows, political meetings, & mass gatherings from being held at the Galle Face Green from April 2023.

Accordingly, apart from religious events, the Galle Face Green would only be opened for the public to spend their leisure time.

#25 Govt announces plans to export monkeys to China



The government announced plans to export 100,000 Sri Lankan Toque macaque monkeys to China to be placed for exhibition purposes at private zoos.

Issuing a clarification on the matter, the Chinese Embassy in Colombo said relevant authorities in Beijing were not aware of the request for monkeys.

#26 Sri Lankan spinner breaks 71-year-old Test record

Sri Lanka spinner Prabath Jayasuriya smashed a 71-year-old record when he dismissed Ireland's Paul Stirling to claim his 50th Test wicket on the final day of the second Test in Galle.

Jayasuriya hit the 50-wicket mark in just his

seventh Test to snatch the record from West Indies' Alf Valentine as the spinner to reach the milestone in the fewest matches.





#27 Court prevents events related to 'May 09' commemoration

The Fort Magistrate's Court issued a restraining order preventing protesters from commemorating incidents related to the 'May 09' peoples' protest in 2022.

The court order was issued based on a request made by the Colpetty Police preventing Sri Lankans from marking one year since the countrywide unrest.

#28 India extends \$1 billion credit line for Sri Lanka by a year

India extended a US\$1 billion credit line for Sri Lanka by one year giving the crisis-hit country backup funds to pay for essential imports.

The credit line was part of about US\$4 billion in emergency assistance extended by India during the


peak of Sri Lanka's financial crisis in 2022 and was scheduled to end in March.

#29 China joins SL debt restructuring meeting as an observer

Sri Lankan authorities formally presented a request for debt treatment in the first meeting of the official bilateral creditors' committee held in May.

The committee, co-chaired by India, Japan and France, consists of 17 members, including Paris Club creditors as well as other official bilateral creditors.

China also attended as an observer, alongside Paris Club members with no claims on Sri Lanka, such as Saudi Arabia and Iran.





#30 ICC visits Sri Lanka over allegations of political interference

Deputy Chairman of the International Cricket Council (ICC), Imran Khwaja arrived in Sri Lanka, as part of the ICC's 3-member committee appointed to look into the political interference in administering the game of cricket in Sri Lanka.

As part of his 'Fact Finding Mission', Khwaja held discussions with the President of Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC), Shammi Silva, and the Executive Committee of the SLC.



43 Sajith Premadasa selected as SJB's Presidential candidate



The Samagi Jana Balawegaya decided to make party leader Sajith Premadasa the Presidential candidate of the SJB.

The unanimous decision was taken by the working committee of the SJB.

432 AG files claim in Singapore HC on X-Press Pearl case



Sri Lanka's Attorney General filed a claim in the High Court of Singapore over the X-Press Pearl incident involving six defendants.

The AG's Department was also considering transferring the case to the Singapore International Commercial Court (SICC) based on the court's rules.







#33 MP Ali Sabri Raheem detained at the airport with undeclared gold

Puttalam District MP Ali Sabri Raheem was arrested by Sri Lanka Customs officials at the Katunayake airport with a stock of undeclared gold and other electronic equipment.

He was found to have 3.5 kilos of undeclared gold valued at Rs. 74 million and 91 smartphones worth more than Rs. 4.2 million.

The MP was fined Rs. 7.5 million and released on payment of the same.



#34 MPs vote to remove PUCSL Chairman Janaka Ratnayake



The motion to remove the Chairman of the Public Utilities Commission of Sri Lanka (PUCSL), Janaka Ratnayake was passed in Parliament with a majority of 46 votes, with 123 MPs voting in favour and 77

voting against it.

H35 Sri Lankan stand-up comedian Natasha Edirisooriya arrested



Natasha Edirisooriya was arrested by the CID for allegedly making disrespectful remarks about Buddhist philosophy and culture.

The stand-up comedian was accused of having made the statements during a stand-up comedy show in Colombo.







#36 Income tax registration made mandatory for professionals from 14 categories

A Gazette notification was issued making it mandatory for professionals from 14 categories to be registered with the Department of Inland Revenue.

Doctors, Engineers, Chartered Accountants, Architects, and Attorneys-at-Law of the Supreme Court, among others, were on the list of selected professionals.





#37 SL enters Guinness World Records for removing World's Largest Kidney Stone

The surgery to remove the world's largest and heaviest kidney stone (calculus) conducted at the Colombo Army Hospital was entered into the Guinness World Records.

The kidney stone was recorded to be 13.372 cm long and weighing 801 g.

Previously, the largest kidney stone found in the world (India in 2004) was 13 cm and the heaviest kidney stone found (Pakistan in 2008) was 620 g in weight.

#38 Online passport system launched

The online passport application system was launched under the patronage of President Ranil Wickremesinghe at the Homagama Divisional Secretariat.

The new process aims to streamline the passport

application process and ensure that passports are delivered to applicants' residences within three days via courier service.




Wildlife Dept assures monkeys will not be exported to China

The Wildlife Department assured the Court of Appeal through the Attorney General after concerns were raised on the matter.

#40 "Mahawanshaya" declared as World Documentary Heritage



'Mahawanshaya', related to Sri Lanka was declared as a World Documentary Heritage by

UNESCO.



The 'Mahawanshaya' is one of the world'slongest unbroken historical accounts.

It presents Sri Lanka's history in chronological order from the 6th century BCE.





#44 World Bank approves \$700 million for crisis-hit Sri Lanka

The World Bank approved \$700 million in budgetary and welfare support for Sri Lanka, the biggest funding tranche for the crisis-hit nation since an International Monetary Fund deal in March.

About \$500 million of the funds was allocated for

budgetary support while the remaining \$200 million was for welfare support earmarked for those worst hit by the crisis.





#42 Rare cricket record for Chamari Athapaththu

Sri Lanka Women skipper Chamari Athapaththu became the first player to outscore the opposition total while chasing in a limited-over international cricket match (men/women).

Chasing New Zealand's target of 127 runs, Sri Lanka

posted 196 for 2 as per the Duckworth and Lewis method due to rain interruption.

Chamari Athapaththu scored 140 runs in 80 balls making her the first player to outscore the opposition total in an ODI.





#43 Sri Lanka are winners of the WC Qualifiers 2023

Sri Lanka sealed the ICC Men's Cricket World Cup Qualifier crown with a comfortable 128-run victory over the Netherlands in the final in Harare.

Losing the toss and batting first, Sri Lanka scored 233 runs in 47.5 overs, which the Netherlands failed to chase, being dismissed for 105 runs in 23.3 overs.

Sri Lanka's World Cup Qualifier performance success was built on the threat of the top two wicket-takers, Wanindu Hasaranga and Maheesh Theekshana.

H44 EU extends GSP+ scheme allowing continued access to SL



The European Commission proposed a 4-year extension to the current GŚP+ scheme until December 31, 2027, allowing countries like Sri Lanka continued access to EU markets.

The Delegation of the European Union to Sri Lanka said the extension of the tariff facility will grant Sri Lanka continued access to the EU markets with the same obligations under 27 international conventions.

French President Emmanuel 45 French President Emmanuel Macron makes historic visit to Sri Lanka




Emmanuel Macron's visit marked the first time a French President has visited Sri Lanka

Singer Umara Sinhawansa faced severe backlash on social media, over her rendition of the national anthem at the LPL opening ceremony during which she was accused of mispronouncing certain keywords of the national anthem.





#47 UNP lifts Harin & Manusha's suspension

The Working Committee of the United National Party decided to lift the suspension that was previously imposed on two prominent members, Harin Fernando and Manusha Nanayakkara.

This move reinstates both individuals as active

#50 'Yaal Nila' luxury train service launched

The luxury train service, 'Yaal Nila', from Kankasanthurai to Mount Lavinia commenced operations in August.

Targeting the Northern Province, the new train service offers first-class tickets for Rs. 4000,

second-class tickets for Rs. 3000, and third-class tickets for Rs. 2000.

The luxury train consists of 106 seats in first class, 128 seats in second class, and 336 seats in third class.

457 Government announces amendment to EPF Act

Wanindu Hasaranga's team defeated Dambulla Aura by 5 wickets in the final played at R Premadasa

Stadium in Colombo.

The 4th edition of the Lanka Premier League 2023, Sri Lanka's top-most domestic T20 tournament with an international flavour, took place from July to August.



454 Sri Lanka football suspension lifted



The global governing body of soccer, FIFA decided to lift the suspension on the Football Federation of Sri Lanka (FFSL) with immediate effect.

The decision was taken by the Bureau of FIFA Council after the FFSL had met the criteria that were laid out for the lifting of the sanction.

#55 AKD selected as the next NPP Presidential candidate



MP Anura Kumara Dissanayake announced that he has been chosen as the candidate of the National People's Power (NPP) for the upcoming presidential election.

Speaking at a television political programme, MP Dissanayake said the decision was made after a thorough discussion within the NPP's Executive Council.





#56 First Sinopec fuel station opened

Sinopec Lanka officially commenced business operations and started fuel supply at its first franchising filling station in Mattegoda West Province of Sri Lanka.

Under the signing of the Long-Term Contract of Importation, Storage, Distribution, and Sale of Petroleum Products in Sri Lanka with the Ministry of Power and Energy, Sinopec has been granted a 20year license to operate 150 fuel stations.



#57 Govt scraps fuel QR system

The government decided to discontinue the QRbased system for fuel purchases, as the nation had sufficient stocks to provide an uninterrupted fuel supply.

The QR system was initially introduced for fuel

purchase following the fuel crisis faced in Sri Lanka in 2022, which resulted in long queues at fuel stations.





458 Govt announces inquiry into 'Channel 4' allegations of Easter attacks

The government announced it will conduct a fresh probe into the allegations made in the video published by 'Channel 4' on the 2019 Easter Sunday attacks.

President Ranil Wickremesinghe, thereafter appointed a committee, chaired by retired Supreme Court Justice S.I. Imam, to investigate the allegations.



#59 Former Sri Lanka cricketer Sachithra Senanayake arrested



Former Sri Lanka cricketer Sachithra Senanayake was arrested on charges of matchfixing, after surrendering to the Special Investigation Unit of the Sports Ministry.

The former cricketer is accused

of trying to fix matches during the Lanka Premier League in 2020 by approaching two cricketers via telephone from Dubai.



The 32-year-old was accused of "stealthing" during sex with a 29-year-old woman without her knowledge in her eastern suburbs home in November 2022.











H81 Two Lankans confirmed dead in Israel- Palestine conflict




A Sri Lankan woman, identified as Anula Jayathilake, who was reported missing in Israel was confirmed to have been shot


